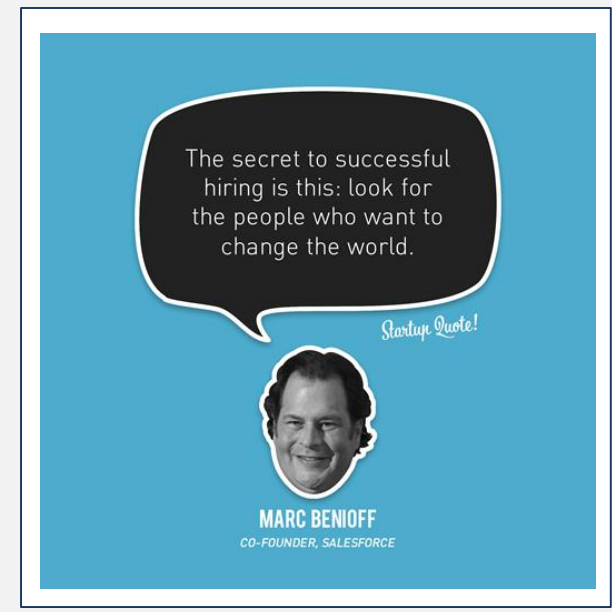
Over time the focus has gone from the pure tech to people and impact.



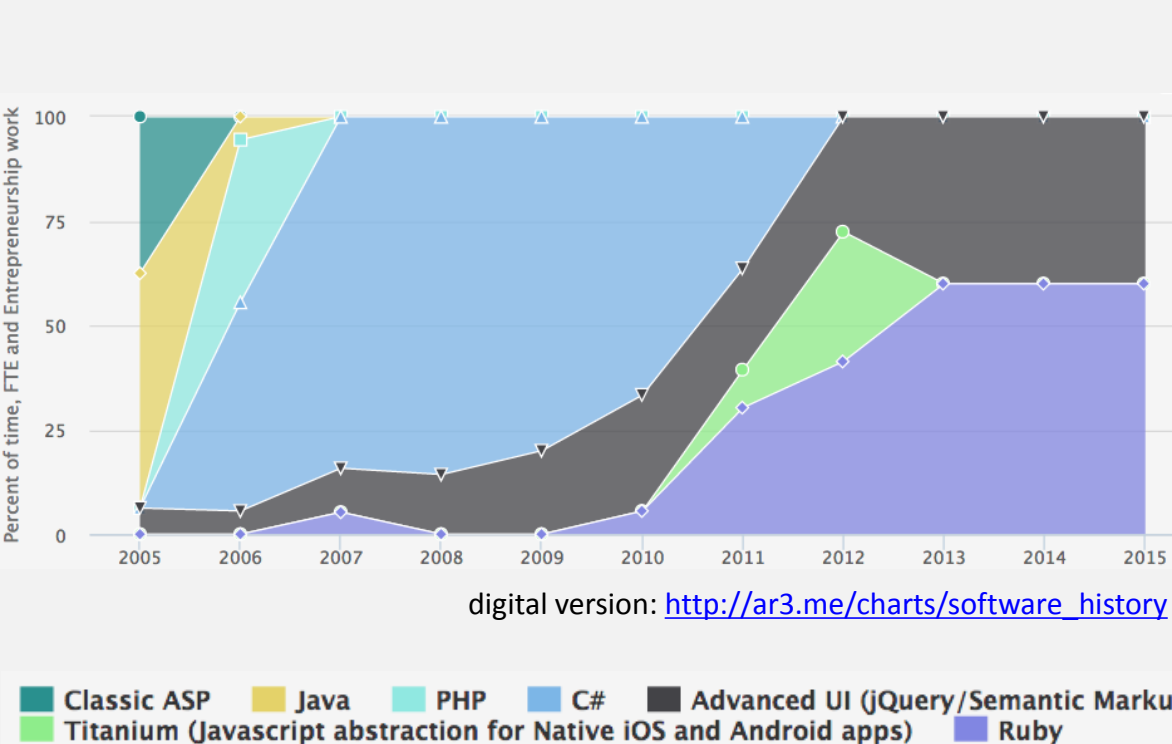
Professional ability is important, but knowing who a person really is cannot be overlooked.

# AR3 – The Hex

The Hex(*agon*) is the result of the retrospection of many projects across many industries and through many years of build software solutions. The goal of this point of view is to give a framework for a successful hi-tech venture.

*Instead of the traditional, and more seemingly intuitive stance, which consists of the business folks ideating with the UX group, and coming up with mockups. These are taken to the ‘pretty-fiers’ AKA the visual designers. They take the now designed app to the developers, who build to this ‘illusion of agreement’. Then once at a point where ready for deployment, they take it to the infrastructure group to get it on a server, for finally the QA group to test it. Once the business sees it, it is either not at all what they really want, or the market has shifted, and it is no longer the best or sometimes even a relevant solution.*

*The Hex simply states, that the best path to success is to have all of the relevant aspects represented at the table, from the beginning. Empowering every person at the table, and iterating over working software.*

## Inbound

On this side, the focus will be on the very technical and usually “behind-the-scenes” roles

## Outbound

On this side, the focus will be on the directly customer focused aspect of building solutions.

## AX

**Application Experience** = Engineers that write the business logic to make the app run

**Tools:** Sublime Text, PostGreSQL, terminal

XP: 10+ years

HP: Shipped many Web and Mobile apps

## BX

**Business Experience** = Those that capture the essence of the problem that is being solved.

**Tools:** Google Analytics, Excel

XP: 7+ years

HP: Multi-time Technical co-founder

## IX

**Infrastructure Experience** = Engineers that handle the servers and systems administration and security that house the app

**Tools:** AWS, SSH, Docker

XP: 3+ years

HP: Led multiple teams of infrastructure engineers

## UX

**User Experience** = Those that focus on the flow of the application from the users eyes.

**Tools:** Balsamiq, Customer Interviews

XP: 5+ years

HP: Primary focus of many applications, I’ve been a part of building is making sure that the flow of the solution was very clear.

## VX

**Visual Experience** = True designers, artists, those with an eye to bring form to the function

**Tools:** Photoshop, Illustrator

XP: < 1 year

HP: The least personally experienced aspect. However, have worked with many designers, across multiple mediums (print, mobile, web)

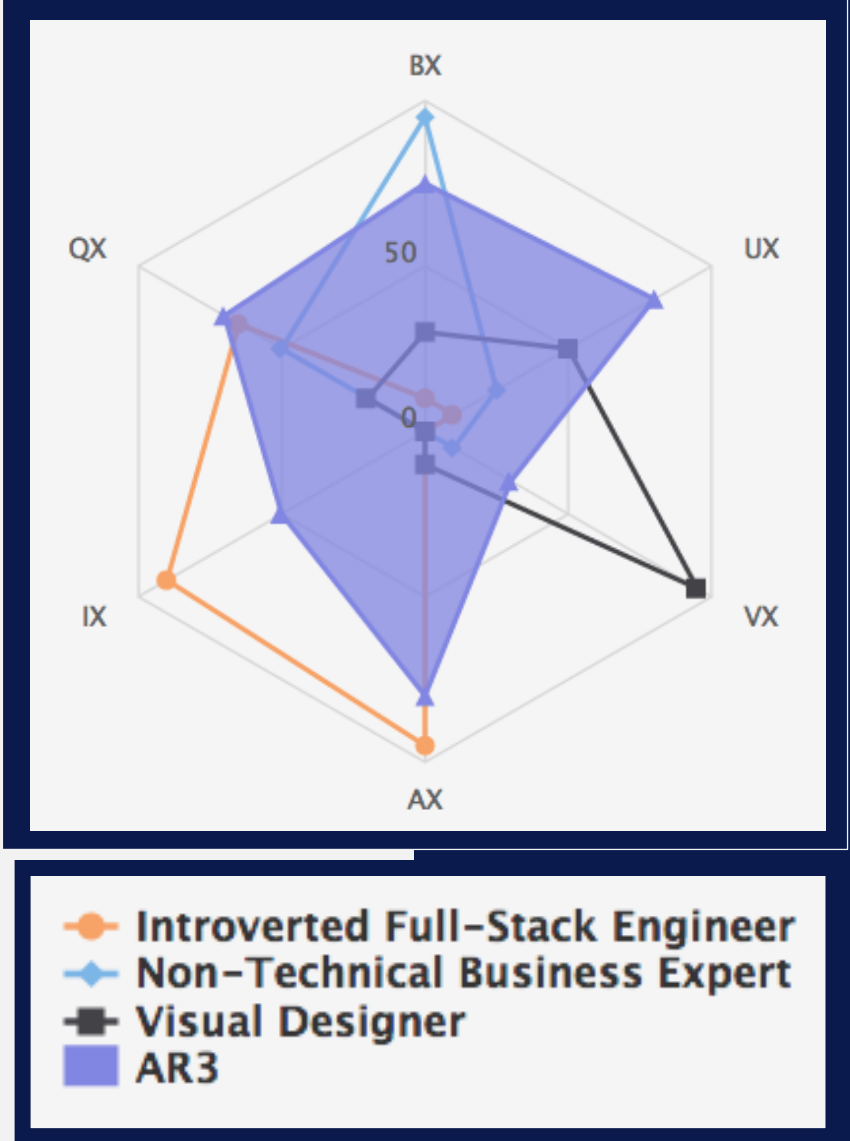
## QX

**Quality Experience** = Range of automated test engineers to Project Managers that ensure that quality is not just in the result, but in every step of the lifecycle

**Tools:** Exploratory testing, automated test scripting

XP: 8+ years

HP: Project managed nearly every project I’ve been involved in over the past 5 years, and helped guide the testing efforts



The final key piece to the Hex is someone to help **bring it all together**. This multi-faceted/multi-hat wearing role goes by many names. Sometimes it is the tech lead...sometimes it is a incredibly involved project manager...often times we call these inspirers Product Managers. Regardless of the name, having someone well-rounded in this role is crucial.

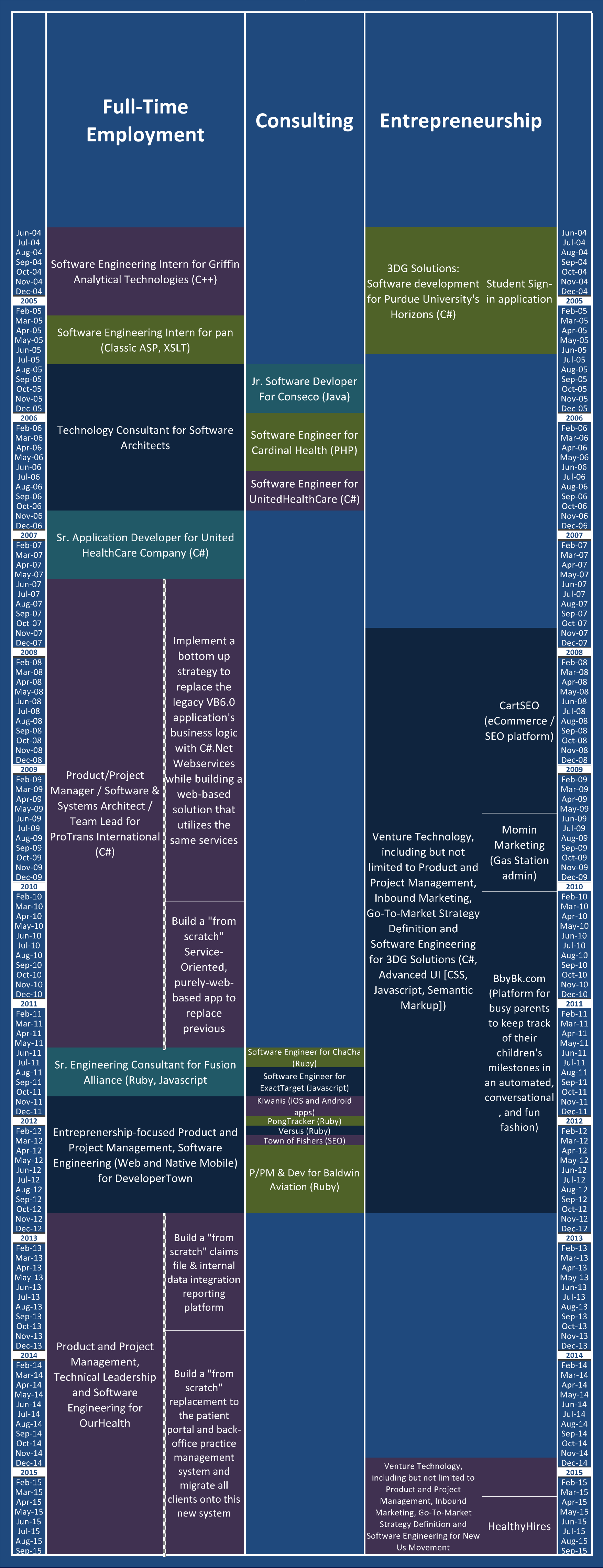
